DID YOU KNOW?

While they are best known at this time of year as the host of your holiday décor, pine trees are also very important to a winter forest!

There are over 120 species of pine trees, which are coniferous or 'ever green' trees. Pine trees grow needles as opposed to leaves which remain in all seasons. Pine trees can live up to 100 or even 1,000 years!

In the winter, pine trees act as host to bird species to nest, or in the case of woodpeckers, to drill into the soft wood in search of larvae between the bark. Small mammals like chipmunks or squirrels enjoy eating the seeds of the pine cones, and deer will occasionally eat the bark. For all of these reasons, Pine trees are a spectacular thing - indoors and out!

ON THE WILD SIDE:

In the first few snowfalls of the year keep a keen eye for animal tracks in the snow - they will help you discover who is sharing your yard or trail! Wildlife for the most part become more illusive this time of year, as they preserve their energy in the dropping temperatures. Birders on the other hand can rejoice as the cooler weather is some of the best time to view our feathered friends. Many birds are attracted to feeders and easier to spot without the forest's foliage. While nature rests, it does not cease to amaze! Snow dusted trees, and sparking icicles all make for a winter wonderland.

Snowshoeing and cross-country skiing can be excellent ways to explore in the snow - allowing you to explore different winter terrain!



Wye Marsh is pleased to announce that equipment rentals will be available for the 2021-2022 winter season to help you explore further!

Cross Country skis, poles, and boots as well as traditional wooden framed snowshoes and modern metal framed snowshoes will be available to rent for use on Wye Marsh's 25 km of groomed trails.

Here at Wye Marsh, we are excited to be welcoming back the swans from their summer breeding grounds, and our birdfeeders, thoughtfully filled by volunteers from CLH Developmental Support Services, are seeing lots of action from birds like chickadees, blue jays, mourning doves and nuthatches (and a big ol' black squirrel we have lovingly named Chubbs). Our project Feeder Watch volunteers are carefully recording their bird sightings a few times a week.

We invite friends new and old to come to visit us on our Open House on Saturday, December 4 for a chance to get holiday photos with Wodin the Snowy Owl, make Bannock by the fire, and enjoy a guided hike, with all activities including admission by donation. 
